Reminder: All law students seeking admission to the New York State (NYS) Bar after graduation must perform 50 hours of qualifying pro bono work. Like all components of the NYS Bar application, completion and certification of these pro bono hours is your responsibility. The Public Interest Law Center (PILC) is eager to help you understand the 50-hour requirement so that you can plan ahead and easily comply.
